Relative share price growth is determined by a comparison of the Paladin share price growth with a hurdle share price of 17.75 cents per share (calculated using Volume weighted average price (VWAP) of a Share for the five trading days before the date of exercise). Vested and exercised Share Appreciation Rights will be converted into Paladin ordinary shares. Unvested Share Appreciation Rights which do not meet the vesting conditions or are not exercised within the exercise period will automatically lapse.
